Jason's technology oversight experience also includes serving as information technology policy coordinator in Florida's Executive Office of the Governor, Policy, and Budget Unit. In this role, he identified statewide policy issues and developed legislation to address shortfalls in state enterprise information technology governance and analyzed and briefed the governor on legislative budget requests. He also monitored IT projects for compliance, testified before legislative committees, and served as the governor's appointee to specialized IT workgroups and task forces.
